R2: 8 - 2 - 8 CL. RW

R3: 8 +(to 2nd p of R2)2 - 8 cl. RW

CH: 5 - 5 - 5. RW

R4: 8 +(to 2nd p of R3)2 - 8 cl. RW

CH: 4 - 4 - 4. RW

R5: 8 +(to 2nd p of R2)2 +(To 1st p of R2) 8 cl. Do not RW

R6: 9 - 2 -- 2 - 9 cl. DO not RW

R7: 8 - 2 - 8 CL. RW

CH: 4 - 4 - 4. RW

R8: 8 +(to 2nd p of R7)2 - 8 cl. RW

CH: 5 - 5 - 5. RW

R9: 8 +(to 2nd p of R8)2 - 8 cl. RW

CH: 5 - 5 - 5. RW

R10: 8 +(to 2nd p of R9)2 +(to 1st R of R 7) 8 cl. RW

CH: 5 ---- 5 --- 5 -- 5 - 5. Tie to beginning.
