Still having fun but its not so fast.

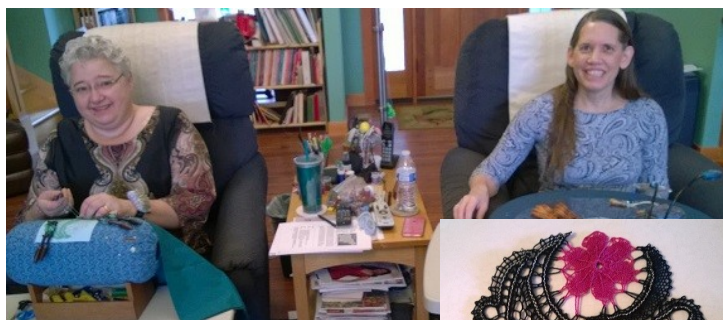
