We must narrow it down to two choices soon so that Maria will have proper time to prepare for the class. Since the stars are made in 5 points, we might do one section of two different designs if we are interested in both.

Website focus pictures for May & June are butterflies, July is red, white, & blue.

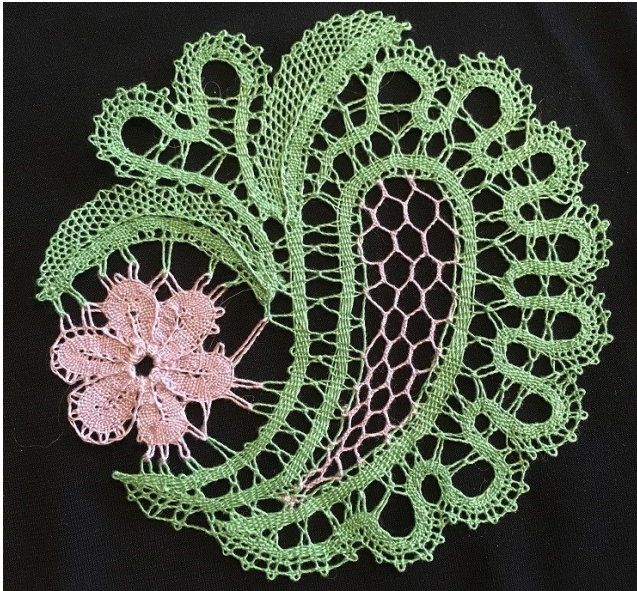

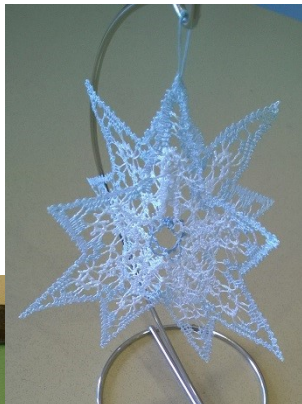


Pauline finished her Idrija piece. Love the color. Nice job.

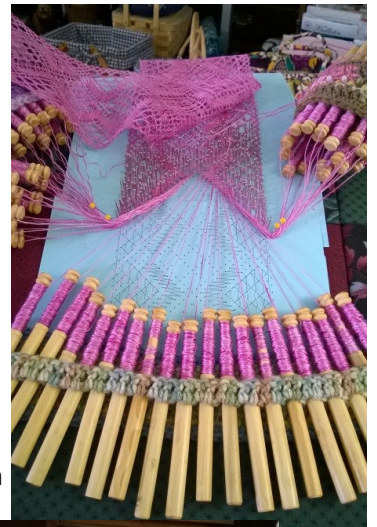
Remember—every 2nd Saturday at The Mill 10 am to noon is an opportunity to share our lace addiction.

I discovered that the crocheted bobbin holders are good for more than just carrying the project.

If you put them on each section to be worked you can then roll them up and out of the way while you work on one section at a time.

This is a scarf out of lace weight Tencel I got at Black Sheep. Yarn is from a local dyer. Her colors are always very well blended.

Scarf pattern is from the book Torchon Lace Patterns 2 by Elsa Van Baaren



Seeing Stars! The class around our Annual Lace Day this year is all about stars.

The book is Florale Sterne and in the library so you do not have to own the book to take the class. Three stars have been chosen for the class, but if you learn a section of any of these stars you can work the other versions of those techniques. The goal is to do one section of the star (or if you are ready for the challenge, pick two). Maria has asked that we keep it simple so she can give us the very best she has on the subject.

The dates are Friday 10/12, Sunday 10/14 and Monday 10/15 Of course 10/13 is Lace Day.

So, sign up for the class. Pick your primary star, make check payable to Portland Lace Society and send to Beverly Davis at the PO Box. After discussion and/or volunteers we will decide on the location of the class.

The patterns call for 100/2 cotton. It is suggested that you may want to increase the pattern and use a courser thread for at least one point. You can change to smaller thread after you have mastered the techniques.

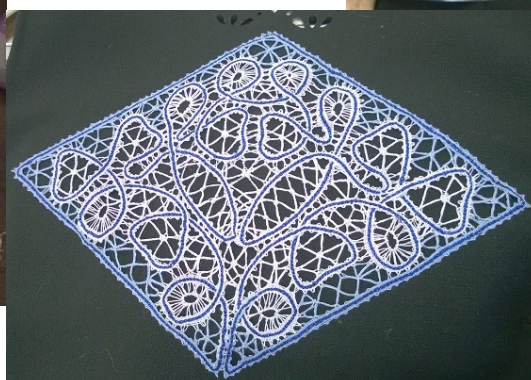
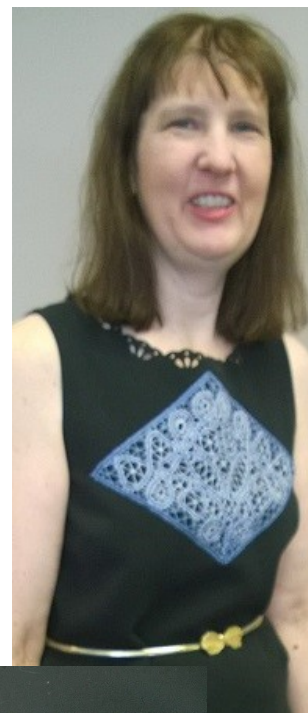
