Seeing Stars! The class around our Annual Lace Day this year is all about stars.

The book is Florale Sterne and in the library so you do not have to own the book to take the class. Three stars have been chosen for the class, but if you learn a section of any of these stars you can work the other versions of those techniques. The goal is to do one section of the star (or if you are ready for the challenge, pick two). Maria has asked that we keep it simple so she can give us the very best she has on the subject.

The dates are Friday 10/12, Sunday 10/14 and Monday 10/15 Of course 10/13 is Lace Day.

So, sign up for the class. Pick your primary star, make check payable to Portland Lace Society and send to Beverly Davis at the PO Box. After discussion and/or volunteers we will decide on the location of the class.

The patterns call for 100/2 cotton. It is suggested that you may want to increase the pattern and use a courser thread for at least one point. You can change to smaller thread after you have mastered the techniques.

The Colors of Texas

The color of a chili can tell the viewer a lot about Texas:

Red - Not only a famed river that makes up a large portion of the State Line in North East Texas, but the color of Long Horn and Santa Gertrudis beef breeds that helped feed the burgeoning United States.

Yellow – While the Chisolm and Santa Fe trails were not paved in gold they made a way for settlers to travel to new farms and businesses that today have made this state and country what it is. It also can be seen in West Texas and the Northern High Plains. If you look closely, you may even spy a halo or two from our patriots who fought at the Alamo.

Blue – While not a chili color per se, it is the main color of the seal of the State of Texas and of the Bluebonnets that are the state flower and a sentimental part of Texas life.

Green – The tall grass prairies of East Texas, and the Gulf Coast. Agriculture is important, but a new addition to the State is the new Financial centers that are helping keep new enterprises coming into the state.

Black – While you would not want to eat an overripe chili, we do want the life blood of the State and our country to continue to thrive, with the oil and oil by products that have helped make Texas a rich and diverse state.

As you walk along the Riverwalk in San Antonio, you must notice that all the colors in my fan are present in grand profusion, day or night.
