Alice presented a thank to Beverly for past president service. Very cute rooster for her collection.


Meeting was adjourned for show and tell.

There are 12 students and they have chosen to do Honiton and Rococo.

Maria has a little flower that will be used at the center of the Honiton star, but we are all invited to make one the first day even if we

will be doing the Rococo star. It is a great little flower that can be used many ways.

Here is what Maria has done with hers

Notes from Maria = The thread you will use is Egyptian Cotton 80 but I do have a larger flower to start in Egyptian 60, Madeira 50 or Broder Machine 50 if you want to try that size first which I recommend. You need 7 pairs with the finer thread wind about 4 yards on one bobbin and about 2 yards on the other bobbin. One pair gimp threads wound singly with about 3 yards per bobbin.



Anyone doing Rococo wishing to try this flower can bring the right supplies and I will bring the larger pattern for size 60 Egyptian with me.

Rococo should wind the same as Duchese except do 10 pairs all with the finer thread. Your pricking should be about 115% of the size in the book but wait to print since I'm still testing that.

A few more notes for you all.

A cookie pillow would be best for these two laces because of the frequent turning of the pillow.

This is fine thread so don't forget your finer pins, your magnifier if you need it with some extra light, your size .4 crochet hook, several cover cloths, magic thread of your choice, and any usual lace supplies that make you comfortable.


