Beverly made this sample of a small piece of Cantu from a tablecloth pattern we want to make. Hopefully at least one of us gets into the Cantu class at convention. That is all up in the air at the moment, but anyway, we have hopes. This will not make it into the final tablecloth, but it looks promising to decorate the front of a T-Shirt. Can't say how many

years this project might take since we both also want to make a Russian Lace jacket. Is it that great minds run in the same channel or all fools think alike? Anyway, we both seem to go chasing the same dreams.

Now its my turn to do a sample. Winding bobbins when this newsletter is done......



Although I didn't get to attend I'm told that the Tatting Quarterly was a big success. Pictured are the rolled ring samples made by those attending.

Jackie showed how to make a lock stitch chain with beads by making a "glue needle" to thread the ball thread through the beads already on the shuttle. Makes a nice necklace or bracelet chain to match the medallion.

In the upper left corner is a sample of an earring that Sherrie brought to show that a purchased post type earring can be pushed through a piece of tatting which makes it easy to wear and no need to fasten a loop to the tatting.

OK, so here is the deal. Never go on Etsy at a weak moment and search for bobbin lace pillows. What happens is you find one! You resist a little bit and then you make the mistake of showing one of your students who then confesses that they have just ordered another pillow. Do you see where this is leading?

Yup, there it is. Direct from Spain. With a pattern book and a scarf pattern just right for that kind of roller pillow. The cover cloths are all made, and I even had the purple thread ready to wind to make the scarf.


I don't know how I'm going to get this started and do the Cantu sample as well, but I see some serious lace making in my near future.



This should be good to go to all those demos on that long list we have for the upcoming summer. (see page 3)








