Meet the Lacemakers. Take time to try bobbin lace and/or tatting.

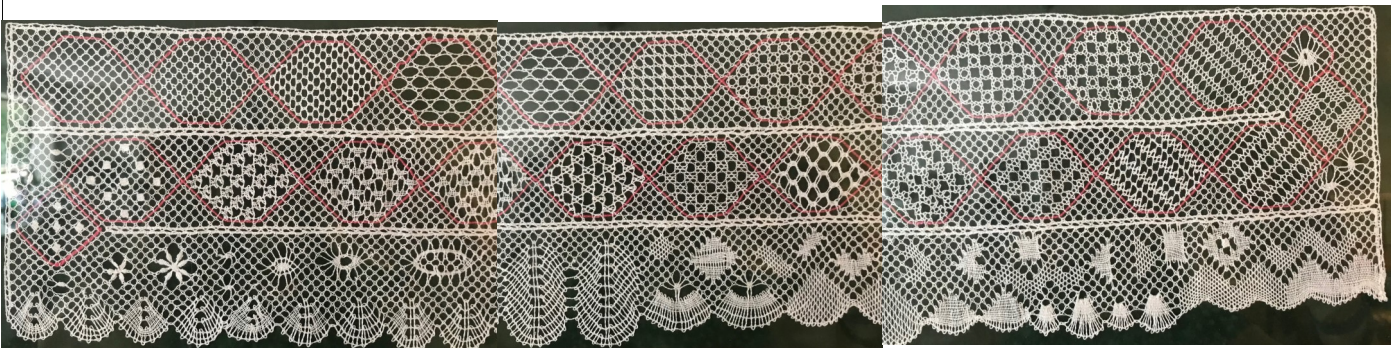
Just hang out and have fun. Bring a project to sit and work on.

Torchon Workshop Project



Advanced Torchon Class - Lyndia Libby Instructor

The Advanced Torchon Class was developed by Lia Baumeister. The class will cover the various grounds and elements of Torchon lace, learning how to draw the stitches and design your own lace pattern. You will make a sampler showing many various grounds, spiders and fans.

Some of you started the course years ago, but may have parts of it left to complete, so you can focus on those areas. I have attached photos of the sampler in 3 parts, because mine is in a frame and I was getting a lot of glare from the glass.

The sampler is made with 26 pairs wound with linen thread 50/2 or 60/2, plus one pair of gimp linen thread 18/2 or DMC Perle Cotton #5. Using a block pillow is probably the easiest way to make this lace. It measures 6 in. x 26 in.

The dates are **October 18-20** at my home in Vancouver, WA.
