PLS Minutes for Oct.3, 2019

Meeting was called to order by President Jackie Nissen with an attendance of 12. We welcomed our guest Tommie Tank who learned about PLS from the Flock and Fiber demo. Jackie sent around the demo book, share sheet, business cards, Australian Lace, Australian Lace Pattern Book, and IOLI Fall 2019. The magazines will be stored in the library. There was no treasurers report.

Demo report: Marilyn C. reported that the Flock and Fiber demo went very well with 11 demoing on Saturday and 6 on Sunday. The demo at Treasures in the Attic also went well with 6 ladies demoing. Upcoming demos are Handweavers Days, October 4-5 from 10:00-4:00; Champoege, October 5 from 1:00-4:00 and Portland Bead Society on October 13. Beverly reminded everyone that if you would like to check out a book, please let her know prior to the next meeting. Be sure you sign the "sign out/sign in" sheet in the manila folder that corresponds with the book title. She showed us several Japanese and European books.

Classes: Lynda reported that the Torchon class on Oct 18-20 is full. We have 12 students signed up. It will take place at Lynda's home in Vancouver, WA. Looking ahead, Beverly reported that the choices of topics for Jean Leaders class will be Torchon or Color in Torchon. This will take place April 24-26, 2020, location is yet to be set. Jackie sent around a sampler of projects for Tatting Quarterly which will be held at Willamette Heritage Center on Nov. 9, from 10:00-2:00. The topic is tatsmithing and attendees need to let Jackie know if they are going to attend the class and if they wish to purchase a pamphlet on tatsmithing (cost: \$7.00 for 10 patterns and directions).

Susan Jones shared a cute pin/needle holder which was made with wooden sewing machine spools. There was a magnet in the center to hold the pins and a small piece of lace around the top. She suggested we make these for next years IOLI convention. So, if you have any wooden spools, please save them. The spools can have thread on them.

The group had a short discussion and agreed to reserve the Milwaukie Center for Lace Day 2020. In addition, Sherry reminded up that she will not be at the December Pot Luck, so we will need to take the paper products.

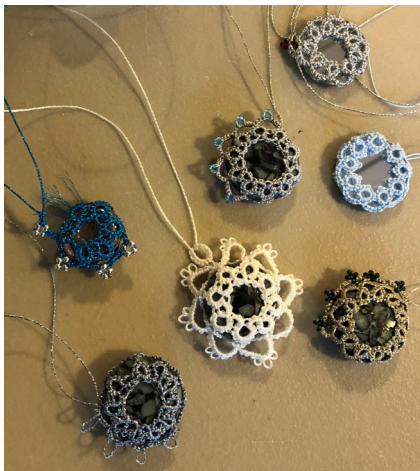

Speaking of Demo's, we had the last one of the year at Champoege. They didn't require dress-up, so it was easier to get there. Thank you Marilyn for setting this up for us



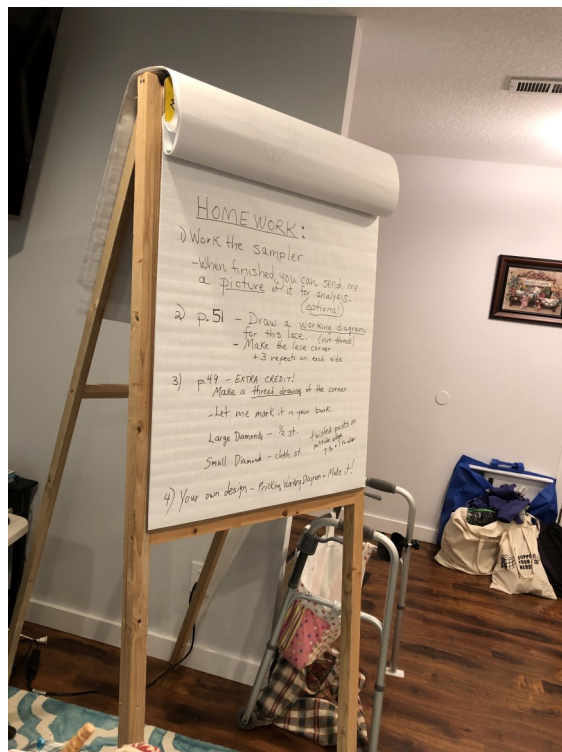
