PLS Minutes for June 3, 2021

Meeting called to order by Vice President Beverly Davis with 13 attending.

Library report: Bev bought three new books for the library: one on Fiandra, one with alphabets, and one with bookmarks with spiders in them. She also passed around a few of the library books for members to look at.

Treasurer's report: as of 6/1/21, PLS has \$32,528.33 in money market and \$1,829.07 in savings. There is an additional \$400 to be deposited. Lace Day went well; PLS brought in a total of \$741 between the raffle tickets and consignment sales. The grange only charged \$55 for the spaces we used, so we did well.

IOLI's "Uncon" runs from Saturday, 7/24 through Saturday, 8/1. Registration is free to IOLI members for the online convention and they are requesting that all members attend the Annual General Meeting if possible, so they can get a quorum. Classes are being held online, hosted by The Lace Museum. See the IOLI website for details.

We discussed dates and topics for our Unconvention in July, which typically is held the same week as the IOLI convention. Bev will be hosting on her porch, Tuesday - Thursday, July 27 - 29, from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm, but she will also have the space available on Monday the 26th and Friday the 30th, if people want to stop by those days, too. Since IOLI's Uncon is online, if someone at Bev's is registered for that (it's free), the video presentations will be available for the group to watch, if desired. You can try some Fiandra, Louise's Milanese video lessons, or bring a project of your own. Bring your lunch and your lace projects.

The question was asked whether we will begin demoing again, and if we have any demo days currently scheduled, but nothing was decided.

Oregon State Fair is being held this summer, so our typical demo dates would be the last Wednesday and Sunday of the fair - September 1st and 5th. Bev will check in with Jackie regarding those demos.

Oregon Flock and Fiber has moved location and dates: it will no longer be held at Clackamas fairgrounds, but at Linn County fairgrounds in Albany - the same location as Black Sheep Festival. The dates for this year are October 23 -24, but it will on the 3rd weekend in October for subsequent years. Please note that the festival is still considered "tentative"; the final decision will be made in early July.

The annual summer picnic was discussed, as well. It was agreed that the weather might be better for the August meeting (8/1), so that's when we'll do it. Rather than a potluck, bring your lunch and a chair and we'll sit outside in the shade near the grange. Since we only have the room from 10:00 - noon, we'll move outside

and try to be finished around noon.

The next meeting will be Thursday, July 1.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 am, followed by show and tell, and lots of catching up.

Materials:

Thread: Finca #40, Aurifil #40, Idrija #40,

Presensia sewing thread #50, Bocken 90/2, Fresia 80/2

Bobbins: 3 pair wound continuously with 2-2 ½ yds on each

Bobbin

Pins: Your favorite, but no super long or fat.

Crochet hook to fit in pinhole to make sewings size 12-14

20" or 22" cookie pillow or bolster pillow and cover cloths, and other tools we need for lace making.

I couldn't resist putting in the Fiandra pieces again.

But recently Beverly brought this piece made in very fine silk. So delicate and pretty. She said it took as long to finish the sewings as it did to make the rest of the piece. Silk does have a slippery mind of its own.



The pillow is a recent acquirement from Sandra. They make a great pairing. The pattern is from the La guipure du Puy book.


Demos are Back! Woohoo!
