Trying out a Fiandra pattern or working from the Milanese DVD are choices available for our Un-Convention for something different. Both are from our library.

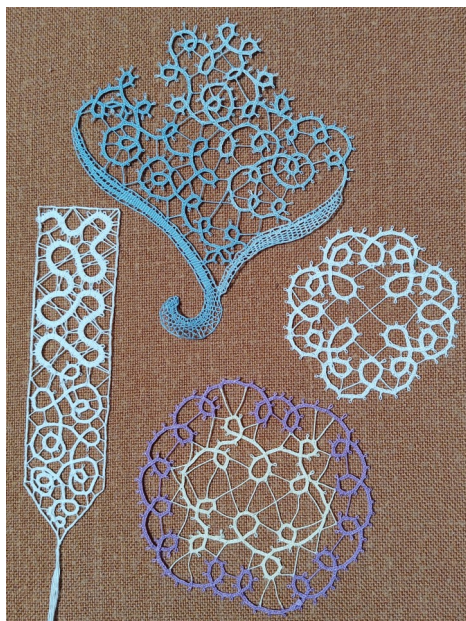
Or if you have a project you have questions about, or even want to just sit and make lace, come to my front porch.
