Bev sent around a signup list for some new demo opportunities:

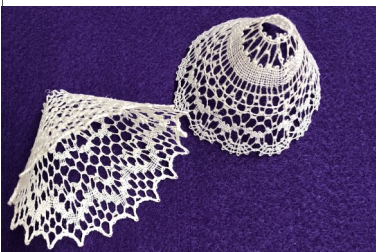
- Salem Fiber Arts Guild 10/1 - 10/2

Accordingly, the following members are being proposed for officer positions for the 2022-2023 years:

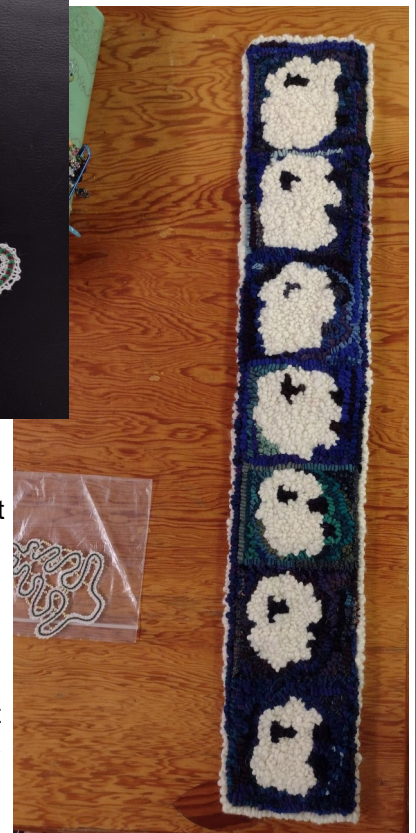

Anna has been busy as usual with many things. First is the little bird picture. She does these so well and has a lot of fun with them. It's like embroidery but with bobbin lace.



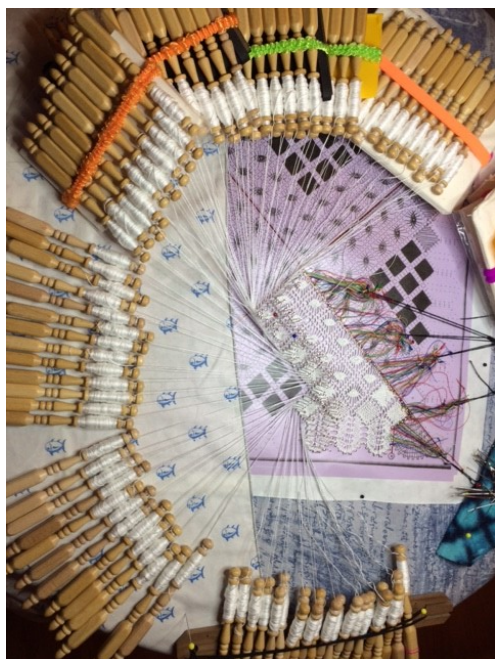
Then she made the doily from the French book I always wanted to do. I'm still wanting, but hers is finished. I'm jealous.

So now she is doing another piece from the French book.

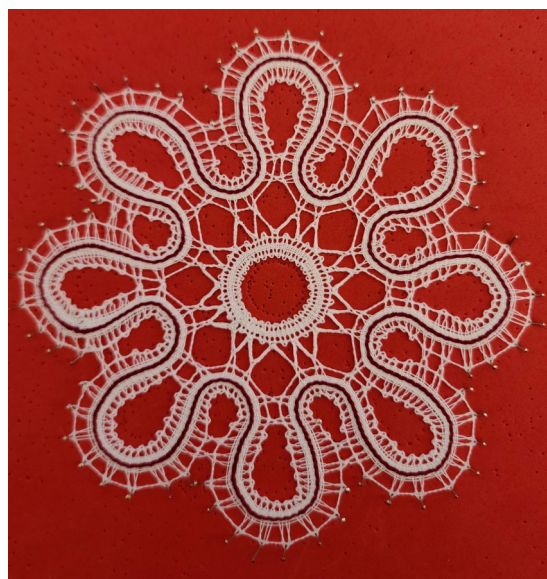
