Nice Colors.

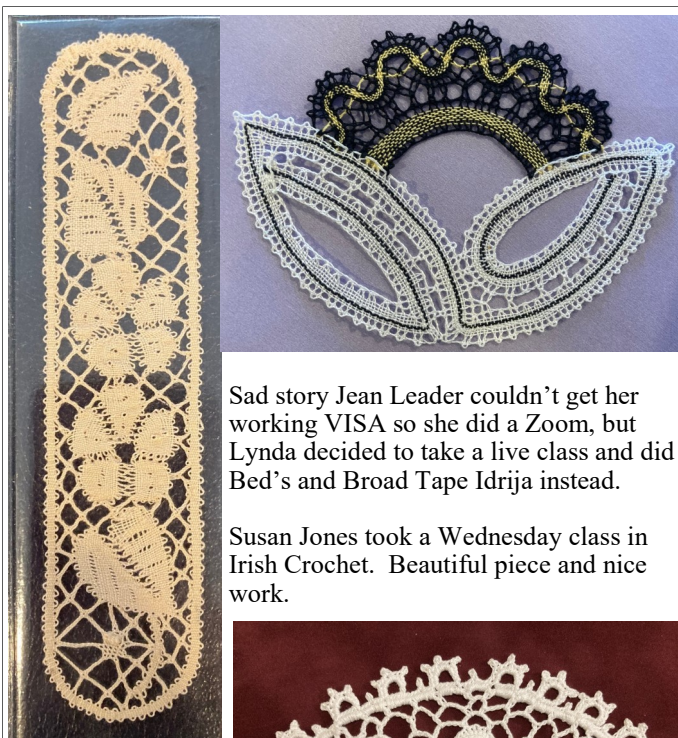
Well now for IOLI Convention. First let's start out with the Goodie bag and goodies.

Beverly took the wire jewelry class and made both of these pretty pendants.



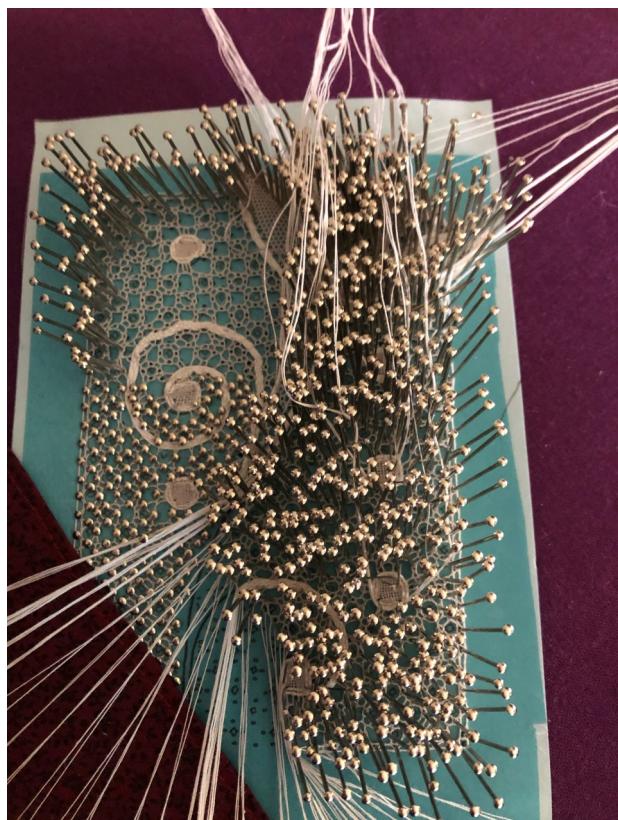
