2-2-23 PLS Meeting Minutes

Bev called the meeting to order with 24 present.

Treasurer's report: the checking account has \$4,360.25.

Alice gave Joyce a lace dress for PLS. Since we don't have a club collection, it was suggested that perhaps the Lace Museum would be the best home for it. We'd like to know more of the history behind the dress, to see if it has a local connection. If so, perhaps the historical society would like it. Joyce will see if we can find out more about the dress.

Demos: Polk County Museum Family Day is March 18th – the same Saturday as Louise's class. For those not taking the class, please consider demonstrating. The museum is in Rickreal, west of Salem.

Bev brought the latest newsletter from the Australian Lace Guild, of which PLS is a member. They are looking to make lace triangles to decorate a cloth that will go on top of their display case at their lace house. Bev is asking our group to make enough triangles to edge two side of a cloth – about 56 motifs – that we could send to them. Any type of lace in pastel or light colors, in Lizbeth 80 or Fil Dentelle size 70 tatting cotton. Bev has the packets with pattern ideas, if you're interested. They would need to be done by August, so she can send them in time.

Louise's class is full. Bev will be in contact with her soon, to find out what we need to have for our projects.

Lise would like to have Bobbi Donnelly come to PLS to teach Tonder; let her know if you're interested.

Saturday 5/20 is PLS lace day: all hands on deck for setup, manning the tables, and cleanup.

Mission Mill in Salem: Sheep to Shawl happens in May, and the organizer wants to include the lacemakers in the fiber to fabric process. Bev is looking for patterns that we could use with spun yarn, and the parameters of what the yarn needs to be (lace weight, fairly tightly spun, not much stretch, 2-ply). More discussion with the organizer is needed.

Oregon Trail Lacemakers newsletter had an interesting graphic of heart cells in different patterns, based on sound waves applied to the cells – maybe inspiring a new lace pattern? They also had a good list of Fair Use rules for patterns.

We had a great time at the class with Louise. Everyone worked hard and we kept Louise on the run. She should be ready for a marathon now.




Next is the Sunflower girls, Lyndia, Joyce and Jackie. This is a complicated project. Some were near the end but I expect to see these completed at the next meeting.

Last but not least the Flamingo project with Jean, Carol and Rae.






Lace Day May 20th 10am to 2pm Winona Grange 8340 Seneca St, Tualatin OR 97062
