Lace day discussions:

Jackie suggested that we touch base with the Eugene and Puget Sound groups to make sure our lace day doesn't conflict with their activities, so they can attend. We did have several ladies from LPS and were glad to visit with them. Jean also suggested that we send out notices early each year of the date for our lace day and follow up with reminders in the newsletter.

Next year:

The Grange staff would prefer that we take the food garbage home to dispose of, to avoid any critter incursions.

We need to decide in advance how we'll handle the extra tickets given to attendees – the prevailing discussion was to just make them extra raffle tickets that they can put in whatever bag they want.

Maybe we could have a small display of different types of laces upstairs, so new and non-lacemakers can see what we do?

Last summer's lace "garage sale" was fun; Bev has suggested we might want to do it again this year – maybe the October meeting?

The August meeting has traditionally been our picnic day but it has been suggested that the September meeting might be still nice and maybe a bit cooler.

Teachers: the group has agreed that we can afford to have two classes this year. The proposal is to have Elizabeth Peterson come in October and Louise in the spring. Bev will contact them and find out when they're available and what they would like to teach. Possibly Brugge and Bedforshire from Elizabeth, with Louise doing Milanese and Bucks.

Jackie proposed that, since we did so well with lace day sales, the student fee for the classes be cut by 50%, to allow more people to attend. The discount would be for members, only. Bev said she had already cut the fee down to \$50, which is enough to encourage people who have signed up to attend without being too expensive for anyone's budget.




Pauline took a class on Tonder. I recognize those tell tale large holes.

Nice samples with great tensioning.






Lise found a great use for some of John Aibe's fancy wood turnings. Before Convention - - - -
