

### 11-2-23 PLS Meeting Notes

Bev called the meeting to order with 18 present.

We discussed dates for Carolyn Wetzel's Amelia Ars class in March and decided on Thursday through Saturday, 3/14 - 3/16. Bev will clarify with Carolyn whether she can teach both styles, or if we'll need to pick one.

Treasurer's report: we have \$6,818.53 in the checking account.

Bev asked for volunteers for Magic at the Mill, which is on 12/22 at Mission Mill in Salem. It's a later session: 4:30-8:00 pm.

Bev and Joyce attended LPS's lace day and sold about \$400 worth of items. It was the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of their club, so a very special event.

Bobbin and Shuttle Challenge: for those who wish to participate, Joyce passed a sign-up sheet around. If you want to, you can write down your guess of how many bobbins you think you have, off the top of your head. We'll have some time to go home and add them all up and bring the actual total back to the January meeting. Tatters should estimate their shuttles and tatting needles, and then count those.

### Rules

Entrants must be current, paid-up PLS members. You may enter the bobbin or shuttle challenge but not both.

Bobbins must be lathe-turned, and shuttles must be actual shuttles; both should have space to wind thread; no makeshift alternatives (clothes pins, pencils, bread ties, etc.); something identifiable that could be sold as a bobbin, or shuttle.

Timeline: the sign-up sheet went around at the November meeting, if you weren't there and want to participate, contact Joyce. Bring your actual bobbin and shuttle counts to the January meeting or get them to Joyce by 1/15/24.

Awards will be announced at the February meeting. There are no "losers" – everyone will go home with some kind of prize.

The meeting was adjourned for show and tell.

She did the coaster and an angel as well, this time in bobbin lace. Henry Rose keeps those bobbins moving right along.





I enrolled in her OIDFA Zoom class and so worked on some stuff from her folder.

Her class was how to diagram patterns, but it also helped tremendously in learning how to read the technical diagrams to work the patterns.







She stays busy, busy, busy.

Recently printed in the IOLI Bulletin. I thought this was worth repeating here. Please note that none of these suggestions says **talk to your neighbor, or laugh loudly**.

### Ten Things to do While You are Waiting for the Teacher by Heather Simmion, MI

- 1) Straighten your pillow. Take a minute to unwind and rewind your bobbins to a uniform length so that when the teacher does get to you, it will be easy for her to work or "rework" your piece.
- 2) Do your favorite ergonomic exercise: shoulder shrugs, neck rolls, wrist circles, etc.
- 3) Surreptitiously look at your neighbor's pillow to see if you can learn anything by watching what she's doing.
- 4) Stand up and walk around, get a drink of water, stretch some more. If the problem has you really frustrated, go outside where you won't bother anyone and scream.
- 5) Put more pins in your pin cushion, tidy up any stray pins on your pillow.
- 6) Wind a couple of bobbins — you never know when you are going to need them.
- 7) Read the catalogs and other handouts you picked up in the sales room (only works at convention).
- 8) Design your next project make a few notes so you will remember or go ahead and prick the pricking if you have it. Some teachers provide additional prickings in class.
- 9) Most teachers set up a display of the type of lace that's being made or a collection of books on the topic—go take a really close look while there's no one else there.
- 10) Take another stab at the problem yourself; what seemed impossible a few minutes ago may make more sense now.

Obviously you do not need to do all 10 of these, but pick a couple that make sense to you given the flow of work to be accomplished.

Remember, you can enhance the class experience of everyone (yourself included) if you practice some common courtesy.


