Winter Lace in Costa Mesa is coming up in February: 2/16 - 2/18.



More Christmas theme with the cov-



Aemilia Ars Needle Lace - Carolyn Wetzel

Aemilia Ars lace is a bold needle lace, styled on 16th and 17th century Punto in Aria patterns as interpreted by modern eyes. The lace can be floral or geometric and is sturdy enough for household linens. The Aemilia Ars Society was central to Italy's version of the Arts and Crafts Movement (1880s-1920s), and shared much of its philosophy and aesthetic. Beginning students in this class will make a small floral motif in order to complete all the steps of the process. Other patterns will be available for continuing students. Traditionally worked in white or ecru thread. Suitable for beginners as well as more experienced needle lace makers. (15-18 hours)





Required materials

Thread:

The *lace* is made with DMC cordonnet special #50 or #60 [6-ply cotton] in white, cream, or ecru; *support stitches are* made with glacé cotton quilting thread [e.g., Gutermann hand quilting 40/3] any color.

Needles:

- 1. Tapestry #26 (large eye, blunt). Have several for working different parts at one time.
- 2. Sharp needle: Sharp sewing needle #8 or #9 for the quilting thread.

Other:

Small sharp thread scissors; Paper scissors; Pricker/needle-vice and needle; Tweezers or forceps; Portable light and magnifier; Thimble optional; Good humor and growth mindset desirable.

A few weeks prior to the class, start taking care of your fingernails if you tend to ignore them. Smooth, nicely rounded nails that extend a bit beyond the tip of your thumbs and index fingers are VERY helpful tools for needle lace.

Instructor will supply:

Patterns and backing materials, instructional handouts, patient repetition of demonstrations and directions.
