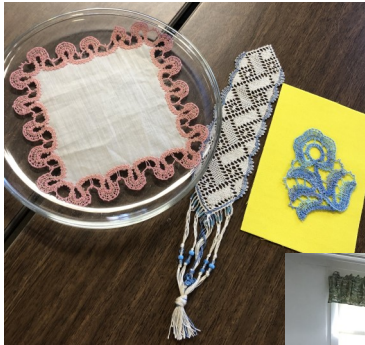
DEMO Coming up

February Show and Tell —



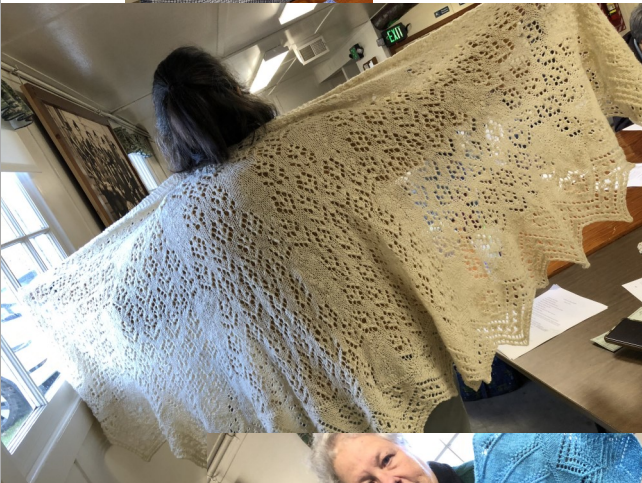
Anna was busy as usual. Schneberger is her latest style. Lia's video to the rescue. You can check it out from the library too.

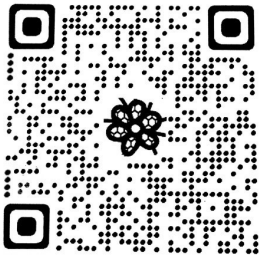
